

Biographical Sketch for: Andy Moser



Mr. Moser is currently the Assistant Secretary of the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation (DLLR), Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning. During his tenure at DLLR, Mr. Moser is credited with obtaining \$10 million in additional funds for the state related to Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC), Regional Innovation, and Workforce Development. Under his leadership, he worked

with the elected officials in Southern Maryland to establish a new workforce investment board for the region. Prior to becoming Assistant Secretary, Mr. Moser served as President\CEO of the Anne Arundel Workforce Development Corporation (AAWDC). Under his leadership, the corporation won multiple national and regional awards for workforce and economic development including the distinguished National Association of Counties' "Workforce Development Award for Excellence", the Comcast Hall of Fame Award for Economic Development, as well as numerous other awards and Congressional citations.

During his tenure at AAWDC, Mr. Moser achieved a national first by opening the first One-Stop Workforce Center at an international airport (BWI Thurgood Marshall International Airport). He achieved another national first when he established two workforce centers inside County correctional facilities.

Prior to becoming CEO of AAWDC, Mr. Moser served as the deputy director for the corporation. Before moving to Anne Arundel County, Mr. Moser was a policy analyst and fiscal administrator for the Governor's Workforce Investment Board (GWIB). During this time, he assisted in the creation of Maryland's five year strategic plan for workforce development, and wrote the performance policy for all workforce areas in the State.

Prior to moving to Maryland, Mr. Moser managed and directed Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) Programs for the Cumberland-Salem Job Training Consortium.

Andy is a graduate of the University of Maryland, where he earned a Master of Science degree in Business Management. He also holds an undergraduate degree in history from Rowan University in New Jersey. He resides in Mayo where he lives with his wife and two daughters.
